The EU proposes to reduce the use and risk of chemical pesticides by 50% by 2030

The new EU proposal aims to contribute to the creation of sustainable food systems in line with the European Green Pact and the farm-to-table strategy, while ensuring lasting food security and protecting our health.

The new measures will ensure that all farmers practice Integrated Pest Management (IPM), where alternative methods of environmental pest prevention and control are considered first, before chemical pesticides are used as a last resort. The measures also include the obligation to keep a register for farmers and other professional users. In addition, Member States have to establish crop-specific standards identifying alternatives to be used instead of chemical pesticides.

This is the path that Europe is designing for us.
